## VSO Rambling Walkers Group

On Thursday April 4th. a group of 12 ramblers whilst on our dike walk, arranged to have a tour of the Vancouver Island Trout Hatchery on Wharncliffe Rd. We were met by the manager Tristan Robbins who guided us on a very interesting walk throughout the facility. We first visited the very large building which
 housed all the tiny Fraser Valley Rainbow trout fry. There are thousands of tiny fry, all kept in very long tubs with the fish being fed automatically every half an hour. From here we walked over to where the fish are kept when they are fingerling size. A special aerator was designed by one of the employees of the hatchery, which has been in production under the name of Aeroboost, and is now in use all over North America. Water for the fish is taken from deep underground and not the Cowichan River. The success of raising so many fish depends on keeping the tanks clean and using filtered and aerated water. When discarding the water from the tanks, all water goes through three separate filtering processes. Again, their large main filtering processor was designed by the same employee who designed the aerator. Once the water has gone through the complete cycle of filtering, it is then emptied into the Cowichan River. The sludge that is finally left over gets sent out to our local farmers to use as fertilizer for their fields. Once the fish are ready to leave, trucks take them by batches to stock over 800 lakes in the lower province. There is also a free program to teach the young ones how to fish, with the use of their donated rods and tackle. The science that goes into raising these small fish is truly amazing. This is all run entirely on the sales of fishing licenses, with no Government input. We all learned an awful lot more than I've been able to write in this article, and found the tour to be very
 enlightening with such a pleasant and informative tour guide.
